The program offers a B.S. in Biomedical Sciences with concentrations in Pre-Health Professions, Biotechnology, and Public and Global Health, as well as a non-thesis **M.S.** degree, for students interested in pursuing careers or graduate study in medical/health professions and biomedical research.

Applicants should possess a Ph.D. in any area of biomedical science and at least 2 years of postdoctoral experience; teaching experience is not required but preferred. The successful candidate will be expected to develop and teach a course in immunology and upper-level elective courses in the program that align with their expertise, e.g. genetics, pharmacology, using modem, high-impact pedagogical practices. The successful candidate is also expected to establish a vibrant, extramurally funded research program and mentor both undergraduate and graduate students, exposing them to contemporary biomedical research techniques.
